CARING FUR YUUR



(The Basics)

- Watering: Keep soil damp not wet, wet soil attracts disease
- Environment: Lots of Sunlight and safe from pets
- Sunlight: Rotate your seedling every few days so your seedling doesn't start to lean
- Space: Plants doesn't like to be overcrowded so thin to smaller seedlings to make room







Hardening Off

(Transitioning seedlings outdoors)

- Check the weather and last frost date for our area
- Start a few weeks before you plan to transplant
- Set seedlings in a protected spot outdoors for a few hours each day and bring them in at night



Transplanting

(Pot to ground)

- 1. Prep your area: water, loosen soil, and add compost
- 2. Dig a hole bigger than your seedlings roots
- 3. Plant seedlings at the same depth as the pot it was in
- 4. Fill in soil around the roots
- 5. Gently press soil around seedling for good root to soil contract
- 6. Water immediately after transplanting and add mulch around your seedling (ex-woodchips, leaves, grass clippings, hay)
